



25% TARIFFS ON CHINESE GOODS INCLUDED IN LIST 3 NOW IN EFFECT

The 25% tariffs on Chinese origin List 3 goods exported to the United States on or after 12:01 AM EST May 10, 2019, is now in effect. U.S. Customs & Border Protection ("CBP") issued a [message](#) to the trade as to how such imports would be handled. Importantly, the CBP message issued this morning notifies the trade that CBP has programmed ACE so as to allow importers of goods en route to the United States before today to pay the 10% duty, rather than the 25% duty.

Per CBP's message, for Chinese origin List 3 goods exported to the United States AFTER the above deadline, importers should report tariff classifications 9903.88.03 and 9903.88.04 (25% duties apply).

For Chinese origin List 3 goods exported to the United States BEFORE the above deadline, importers can pay the lower 10% previous List 3 duty rate by reporting tariff classification 9903.88.09.
